Parental survey feedback 2020

Thank you for taking time to complete the recent survey. We received a record breaking number of 164 responses which is a significant representation considering many of you also filled in one questionnaire on behalf of all your children. The numbers can be found on the back of this letter but I would also like to share some common themes with you as well. This is what you told us:

What you thought we do well:

The majority of you told us that your child enjoys school, they are kept safe, make good progress, that teaching is good and the children have fun.

One parent commented: "I am happy with the school because my children have made pretty good progress."

Another comment was: "I like that they do many activities for children to have fun."

There were many comments about the school community concerning the friendliness, caring/helpful and approachable nature of staff.

Another parent wrote: "My child has always been happy at school. Teachers are professional and caring."

One parent said: "I am happy to let my child study here because all staff always are caring and take care of my child."

There were several positive comments about the community events and charity work within the school and good community involvement. There were many positive references to the school's multicultural, inclusive and diverse approach.

One parent stated: It's a community-approachable staff. My child feels "special" which is important and hard to achieve."

Another parent commented:

"We like how you include all religious denominations which makes all cultures feel welcome." PTO



Many of you commented positively on the breakfast/ after school club provision as well as the extra-curricular provision and trips on offer.

You told us you like aspects of our communication such as listening to children, newsletters, and texts. You liked the fact that school runs to time and that punctuality was encouraged!

What you thought could be improved:

Although you appreciated the range of extra-curricular activities, some of you want to see even more, with more spaces available.

Some of you raised issues and queries pertaining to the school's behaviour policy e.g. how the school approaches discipline and anti-bullying.

Some of you said you would like to see improvements to aspects of the school environment such as the playground and water fountains.

Many of you commented on improving the school lunches and them needing to be of a consistent high quality and value for money, and that the food offer throughout the school needed to remain healthy. Some of you wanted to see an improvement in lunchtime provision.

Although many of you commented on good communication some of you felt that this could be improved by being more bespoke and individualised at times.

Interests:

A significant number of you told us you would be interested in us extending the hours for breakfast and after school clubs. Many of you said you were interested in being involved in adult learning classes and some of you said you were prepared to help out in school and share your skills with the children.

One of the things that also struck us was the significant number of you who ticked "don't know" for some answers. This will also be a discussion point for our staff team and for us to think of effective ways we might keep you better informed and communicate key information.

I wish to say a big thank you for giving us such useful feedback. It will be used to inform our school improvement plan and will also be shared with Governors for their consideration. We look forward to keeping you updated throughout the course of the year.
